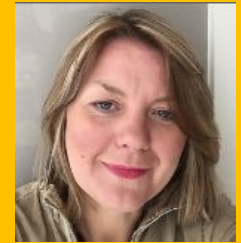

Points to bear in mind...

- A straightforward Year 12 doesn't guarantee success at Year 13; hard work is still required!
- Faster pace, more content, focus on exam technique
- Students require independence and discipline to keep working hard whilst applying for Uni and jobs etc.
- Don't struggle - seek support and guidance from teachers to iron out misconceptions or seek help for wellbeing



Learning Zones

- **A “traffic light” signal system used to support students in understanding the different types of teaching and learning activities which are scheduled throughout a school calendar year.**
- **Provides students with a timeline summary of scheduled Learning Cycle Assessments and ensures support materials are provided at specific points during the year to give opportunities for structured preparation specific to the upcoming assessments**
- **Encourages and supports independent learning within a timetabled structure, develops organisational skills, time management skills as well as accountability.**
- **If followed appropriately this will support individual recap and recall of content, improve understanding therefore lead to improved LtA grades.**

Advice for Parents

Do encourage and **support university visits** / open days

Provide **praise and encouragement**

Do **discuss Learning Cycle reports** at home

Use the **8/8/8 rule** to support balance and healthy work patterns
