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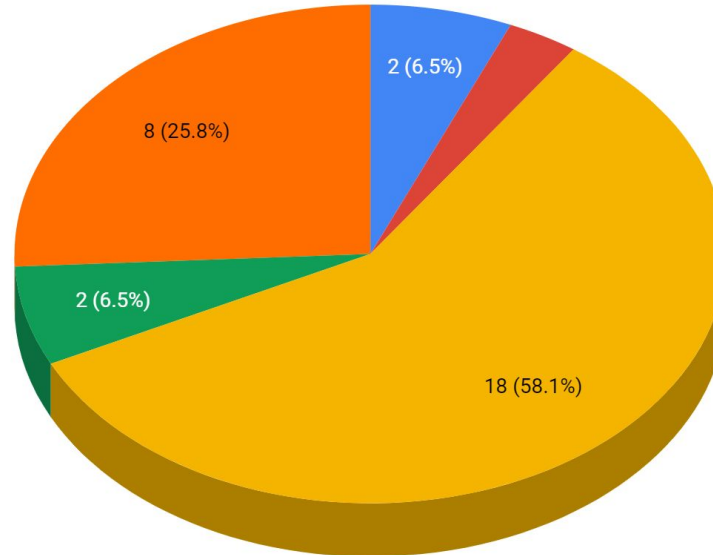
Destinations of Leavers 2020

Revision - not just about exams!

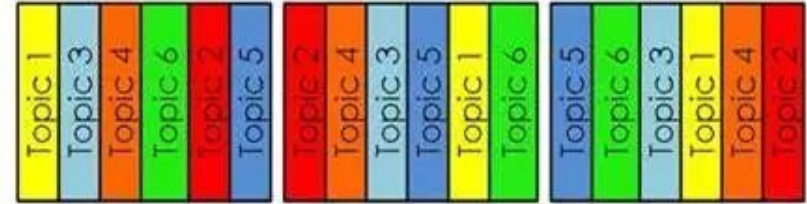
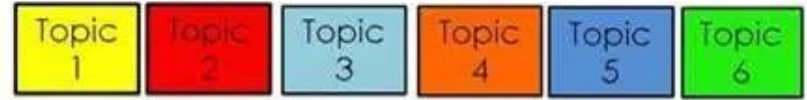
Year 13 still need support at home with revision.

Students have much greater independence and control over their learning and study habits in the Sixth Form. Good habits embedded now will underpin great progress in next year's exams.

Students should be constantly revisiting and reviewing from now. Research shows practice questions are the most effective tool for securing great progress.

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Students at John Colet have access to an online platform called Unifrog and Year 13 are writing their personal statements and teachers are writing references on it.

Parents can access it too.

This term is when decisions should be made regarding pathways after JCS.

Students should continue to research different paths - University, apprenticeships, gap years, employment.

Encourage your sons and daughters to record their skills, activities and experiences in order to build their portfolio.

Pathways and UCAS



Students can apply to UCAS for university places and degree level apprenticeships.

UCAS require students to write personal statements when they apply. The school deadline for applications is November (NB the early deadline for applications for Oxbridge is 15 October 2020). All other applications must be with UCAS by 15 January 2021.

It costs £26 to apply and students can apply to UCAS and other pathways at the same time.

There are useful links on the Sixth Form area of the website to support with the UCAS process.
