#### **Targets**

- FFT5 Targets are given for all subjects.
  - Based on KS2 prior attainment
  - Take into account the nature of different subjects
- Academic Potential
  - Cognitive Aptitude Tests (CAT)





### **Monitoring Progress**

- Student progress is monitored and assessed regularly.
  - Classwork
  - Class contributions
  - Homework
- Once per term students have a standardised assessment in every subject.
  - Short tests
  - Long answer question
  - Project work
