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### Seasons Greetings to all parents and carers and to our Year 12 and Year 13 students

What a busy first term it has been! Our new Year 12 students have settled into life in KS5 and Year 13 are working hard with focus on the Mock Exams which take place in the New Year. Alongside the curriculum there have been so many events and activities. I do hope that all of you enjoy a restful holiday and that students return refreshed and excited for the Spring Term. The Sixth Form team is led by Mrs Fanchi (Head of Sixth Form) and comprises four experienced form tutors with extensive experience of pastoral support, Post 16. Mrs Sinacore (Assistant to the Head of Sixth Form) supervises our study facility, assists students and provides administrative and pastoral support each day.

### Events of the half term

With many of our students passing their driving tests and many students finding themselves passengers in their friends' cars, the message of how to keep safe on the roads was shared when Year 12 attended **Safe Drive, Stay Alive** and reiterated by a talk to all students by Bucks Fire and Rescue Service educator, Keith Wheeler. Whilst an emotionally uncomfortable experience, the lessons learned are so important in keeping our young people safer.

A group of 11 students from the Sixth Form, along with two from Year 10, have been participating in a 6 weeks course learning British Sign Language. This is part of the Sixth Form Enrichment programme on Tuesday afternoons and the group have been working hard to learn lots of vocabulary. Their teachers, Jill and Heather, along with Hearing Dog, Kit, have been very impressed with the speed the students have learned and their dedication and enthusiasm. There will be another 6 weeks course running in the Spring Term and then an intermediate course for those who wish to develop their skills further, early in the Summer term.

Year 12 are participating in the **National Film and Television School Challenge** and the team who were mentioned last half term as Round 1 winners have now produced their film and have submitted it to the NFTS for judging. The team of Max, Amy, Becky H, Pearl and Josh worked hard to create a great advert for the school. Watch this space for the result!

We are lucky in the Sixth Form to have a team of very talented and enthusiastic footballers. The team play recreationally as part of enrichment on Tuesday and played a competitive match against Aylesbury Grammar School this half term. The JCS boys secured a decisive 9-3 victory over AGS and, under Euan Anderson's captaincy, the goal scorers were Euan (3), Dan G-P (2), Ted M (2) and Zack H (2). GREAT!

A group of boys and girls from the Sixth Form participated in a **Self Defence / Martial Arts** session led by Ben Babbington of [www.zksmartialarts.co.uk/](http://www.zksmartialarts.co.uk/). The students were able to practice strategies for getting out from under their opponents, grappling techniques and ways to defend themselves along with building confidence and having a fun time with their friends. The feedback was 100% positive so I am intending to offer this class again in the future.
