External Speakers

Our first external speaker back after half term was Sue Hunter from the Terrence Higgins Trust who connected via Google Meet on January 13th. She spoke to all of Sixth Form about her life after contracting HIV, proving that anyone can become infected regardless of their age, health, gender, and sexuality. We were informed about the ways that one could get HIV, the symptoms of it, the preventative methods, and how regular testing is crucial as some people don't have symptoms until it is too late to get treatment.

Hunter emphasised that HIV changes not only the infected individual but also the people close to them. Sue Hunter taught us that although having HIV is incurable and has changed her life and relationships, she is as happy and as healthy as she can be, and that we shouldn't view HIV with the stigma that it is associated with.

She said that the Terrence Higgins Trust was there to help her when she felt confused and saddened by her diagnosis, and that their job as the UK's leading HIV and sexual health charity is to support people and ensure their voices are heard through campaigns and talks in schools. They are currently working to end new transmissions of HIV in the UK by 2030.
