

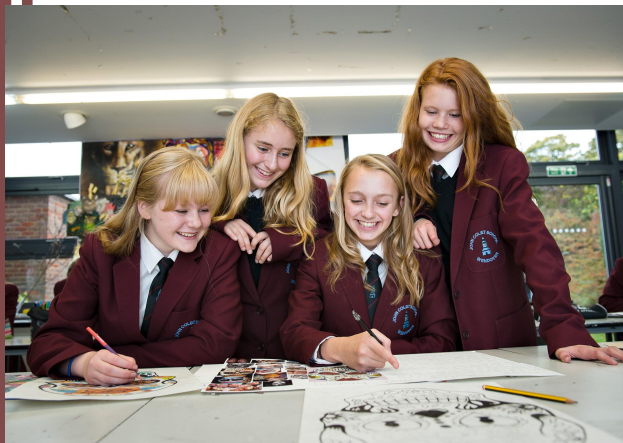

- Security around the site
 - Fencing
 - Lanyard system
- Registration
- Staff awareness / training
- Child Protection Policy



- To ensure staff are trained and aware of how to spot potential safeguarding issues
- Liaise with Children's Social Care
- Maintain accurate records
- Ensure the required checks have been carried out on staff, contractors and visitors
- Ensure your child knows who they can go to if they have anything they need to speak about or have concerns about a friend.

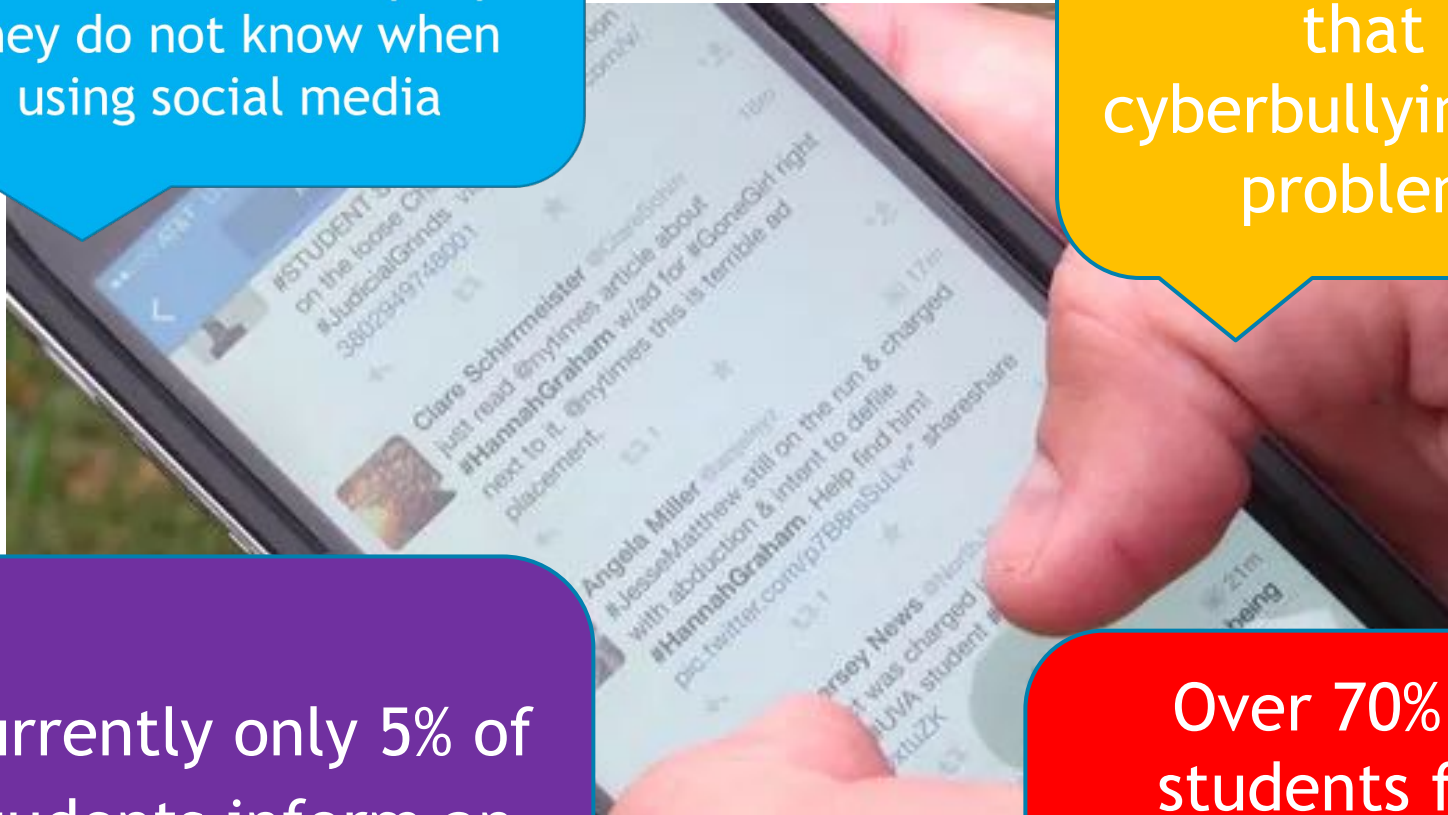
Kayleigh's Love Story....
