


Supporting Learning

Hands off? Or hands on?

Spacing and retrieval is best.

Revision - not just about exams!

Blocking vs interleaving



Students have much greater independence and control over their learning and study habits. Good habits embedded now will pay dividends later.

Year 12 matters. No external exams but some course do NEA or unit exams.

Students should be constantly revisiting. Research shows practice questions are the most effective tool for securing great progress.



Enrichment - development of character

Following feedback from students last year I have introduced the Tuesday p5 enrichment programme. It includes recreational sport, reading, life skills, gardening, leadership opportunities. Exam condition assessments - 9 this year, 3 per subject.

Community Service - 10 hours per term is expected per term in Year 12. This is very important to personal statements and applications etc. Many are engaged in peer mentoring and other leadership roles.







Students at John Colet have access to an online platform called Unifrog and Year 12 will be using it to research and, next year, to write their personal statements.

Parents can access it too.

Students should begin researching different paths - University, apprenticeships, gap years, employment.

Encourage your sons and daughters to record their skills, activities and experiences in order to build their portfolio ahead of next year.

Pathways and UCAS



Students can apply to UCAS for university places and degree level apprenticeships.

UCAS require students to write personal statements when they apply. The school deadline for applications is always in November (NB the early deadline for

applications for Oxbridge is in October).

It costs £24 to apply and students can apply to UCAS and other pathways at the same time.

There are useful links on the Sixth Form area of the website to support with the UCAS process.

A work experience or work shadowing placement is compulsory for Year 12 students. It will take place during our school 'Focus Week' which is 29 June 2020.

Students can travel further and participate in a wider range of activities now they are Post 16.

The key for this placement is it must be meaningful. It should link to possible careers or use skills students have as strengths. It should enable students to learn more about their future pathways and provide valuable learning opportunities. It should not be an extension of their part time job!

JCS can assist in finding placements if students are struggling but with 9 months to plan, it is much better if students go through the research process and approach organisations themselves.


